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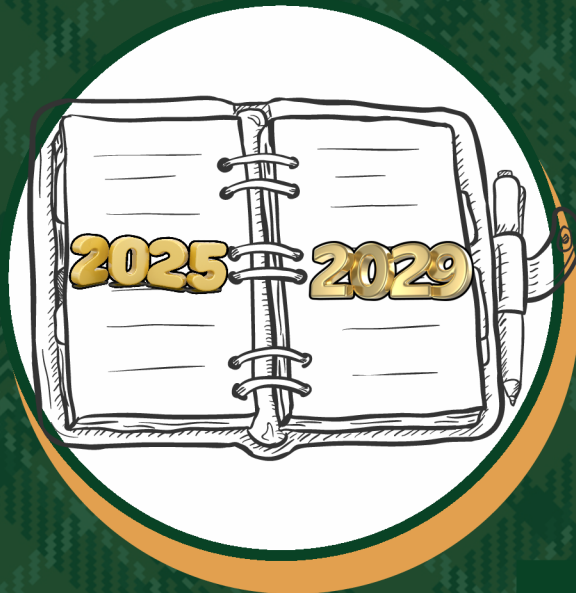

# INTRODUCTION

Our AfricTivistes 2025 Strategic Plan lays out a roadmap for strengthening democracy, human rights and governance through technological innovation and citizen engagement. This plan also marks the tenth anniversary of AfricTivistes, an important milestone that reaffirms our role as a key player in digital democracy on the continent. The Plan is structured around five strategic pillars:

- Technological Innovation
- Elections, Democracy and Governance
- Citizen Engagement
- Media and Information
- Training, Research and Documentation

This plan reflects AfricTivistes' commitment to the empowerment of African citizens and institutional stakeholders in an increasingly digital world. It was developed using a participatory approach, integrating the perspectives of stakeholders across the continent, including civil society organisations and movements, governmental, regional and continental partners, media professionals, academics and technology experts.

It prioritises key areas where AfricTivistes has demonstrated expertise, such as the fight against digital censorship and disinformation, the promotion of participatory democracy, the development of citizen-led initiatives, the creation of communities of good practice, electoral transparency and the strengthening of digital resilience among activists and journalists.

With this strategy, AfricTivistes aims to expand its reach, innovate in its approaches and deepen its impact. By fostering partnerships, harnessing the power of technology, promoting inclusive governance and strengthening citizen participation, the pan-African network seeks to create a future by Africans and for Africa.

This document is not just a plan; but a rallying call to action mobilising supporters, partners and allies to join AfricTivistes in this shared vision of an Africa where civic tech fully serves democracies.

# CONTEXT

Africa has seen a steady rise in civic engagement in recent decades, with populations increasingly demanding transparency, accountability and inclusion in decision-making processes. Africa's path towards democratic governance has been characterised by both significant progress and persistent challenges. However, despite this progress, many countries continue to face obstacles such as electoral manipulation, civic space restrictions, disinformation and digital security threats. These challenges, compounded by rapid technological change, highlight the need for greater citizen mobilisation and innovative solutions to enhance people's capacity, support institution-building and help improve democratic processes.

AfricTivistes, as a pan-African network, operates at the intersection of technology and democracy, harnessing digital tools to equip citizens, combat mis/disinformation and improve governance. Its work is based on the premise that informed, engaged and connected citizens are the backbone of resilient democracies.

The 2025 Strategic Plan builds on AfricTivistes' past successes, responding to the evolving needs of the continent by integrating civic tech into governance processes and fostering a culture of engagement and participation.

This Plan comes at a critical time when digital transformation is redefining the interactions between societies and governance. It also comes at a time when democracies are experiencing an unprecedented crisis, particularly amid the resurgence of military coups and popular uprisings.

By aligning its objectives with the continent's democratic priorities, AfricTivistes aims not only to meet the current challenges of access to information, the fight against disinformation, citizen participation and youth involvement, but also to anticipate the growing challenges of digital sovereignty. This approach will strengthen the foundations of an Africa where every citizen, thanks to digital tools, plays an active role in upholding democracies and building a sustainable future.

  - Establish early warning systems for digital security
  - Implement security protocols tailored to the African context
  - Organise cybersecurity training programmes
  - Implement rapid response mechanisms for security incidents
  - Develop digital backup and resilience solutions

Strengthening the integration of digital technology into democratic electoral processes in Africa

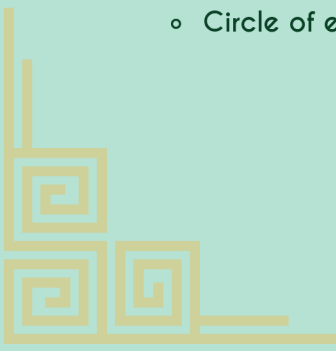

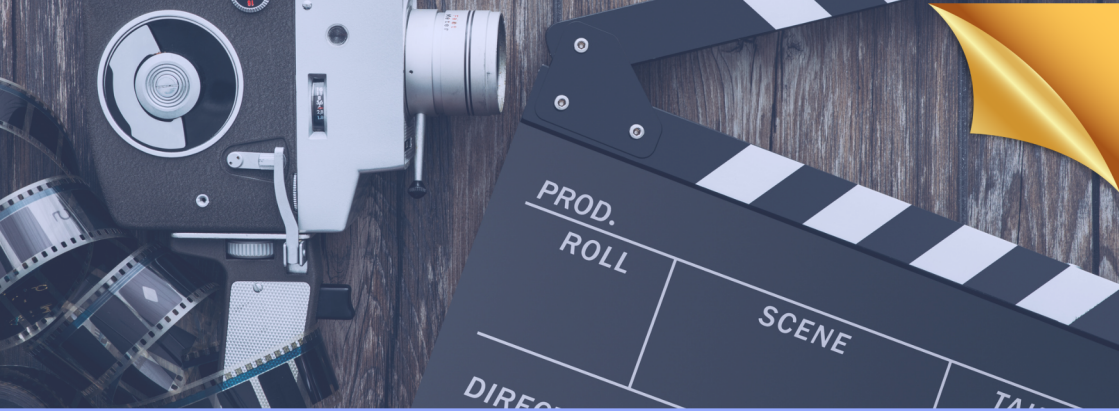
